

According to official data, by the end of 2025, approximately **80,000** patients will need prosthetics of **150,000** limbs. Given that *30% of Ukraine is mined, even more people will have lost limbs by that point. Even if the war ends today, people will continue to lose limbs due to mines. Most patients have multiple and complex amputations, so they need a long rehabilitation period and extensive psychological support

War injuries in Ukraine differ from previously known injuries from the wars in Afghanistan, Iraq, and Vietnam. For example, among American soldiers in the World War II, 64% of injuries were caused by explosives. During the Korean War the percentage of those were 54%, and in Iraq – 68%. Today, according to preliminary data, about 95% of injuries in Ukraine are mine blast-explosive. About 30% of the wounded lose their upper limbs. The specificity of war injuries in Ukraine is that they are almost always combined injuries.

We are building a country of superhumans!

Those who were injured in war and found the strength to live on are Superhumans. To give them a chance for a decent life, we are developing the Superhumans War Trauma Center. Where military and civilians, adults and children affected by war can receive not only the highest quality medical services free of charge, but also get support up to full reintegration into society and the workplace.





Department of Reconstructive Surgery:


