According to official data, approximately **30,000** patients will need prosthetics by the end of 2023. Taking into account that 40% of Ukrainian territory is mined, many more people will lose their limbs. Most of the patients have multiple amputations and complex amputations, therefore requiring a long rehabilitation period and psychological support.

---

**Based on the experience of Iraq and Afghanistan**

Of 8,058 military casualties (level II+):

- 70.5% had major limb injuries
- 5.2% required amputation
- 88% of amputations caused by explosions
- 18% required more than 1 amputation

During Vietnam war 5.5% of all injuries required amputations

To give them a chance for a superhumans life, we have launched a state-of-the-art rehabilitation center for adults and children.

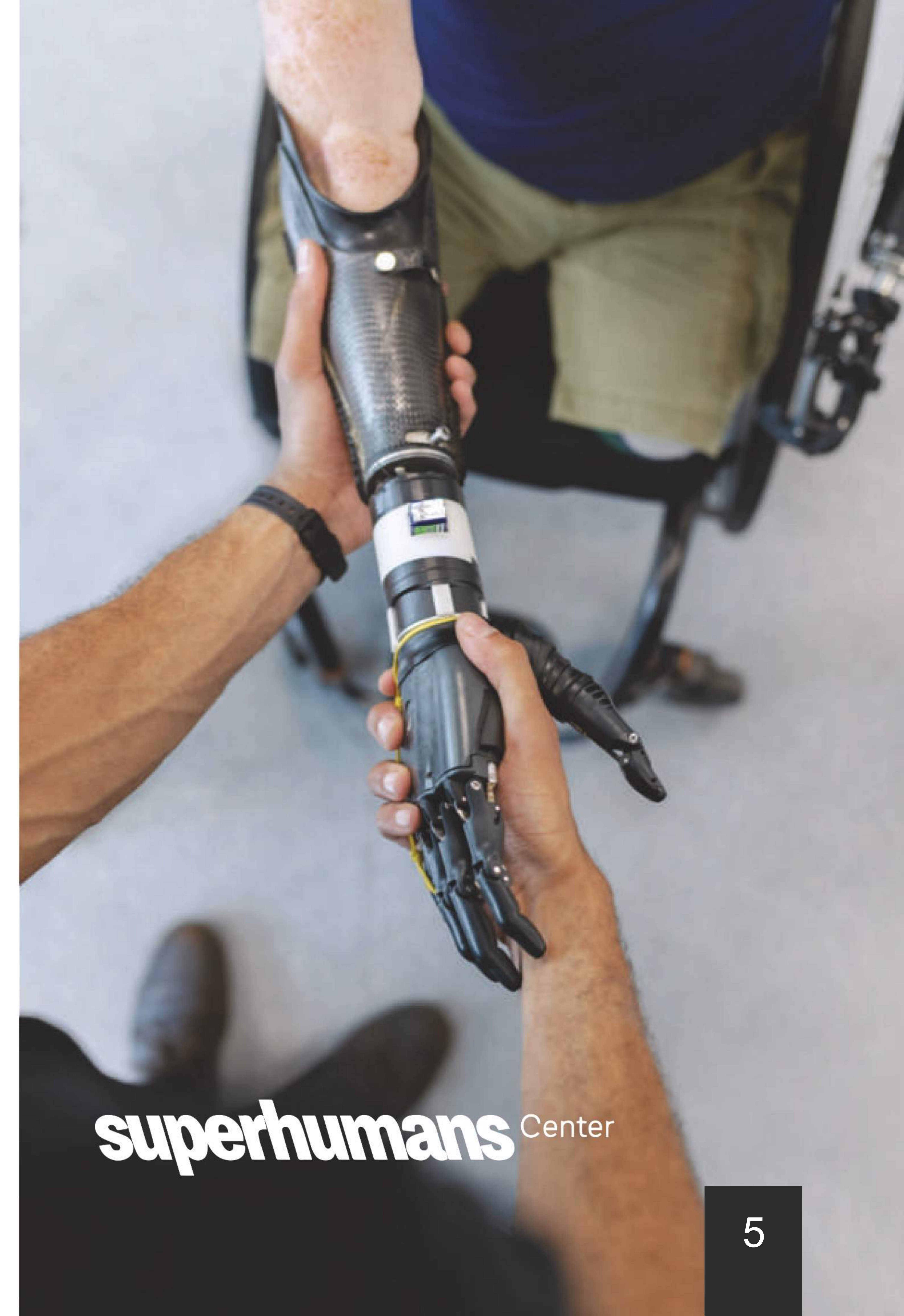

- Turn Ukraine into a "country of superhumans", instead of a "country of traumatized people".

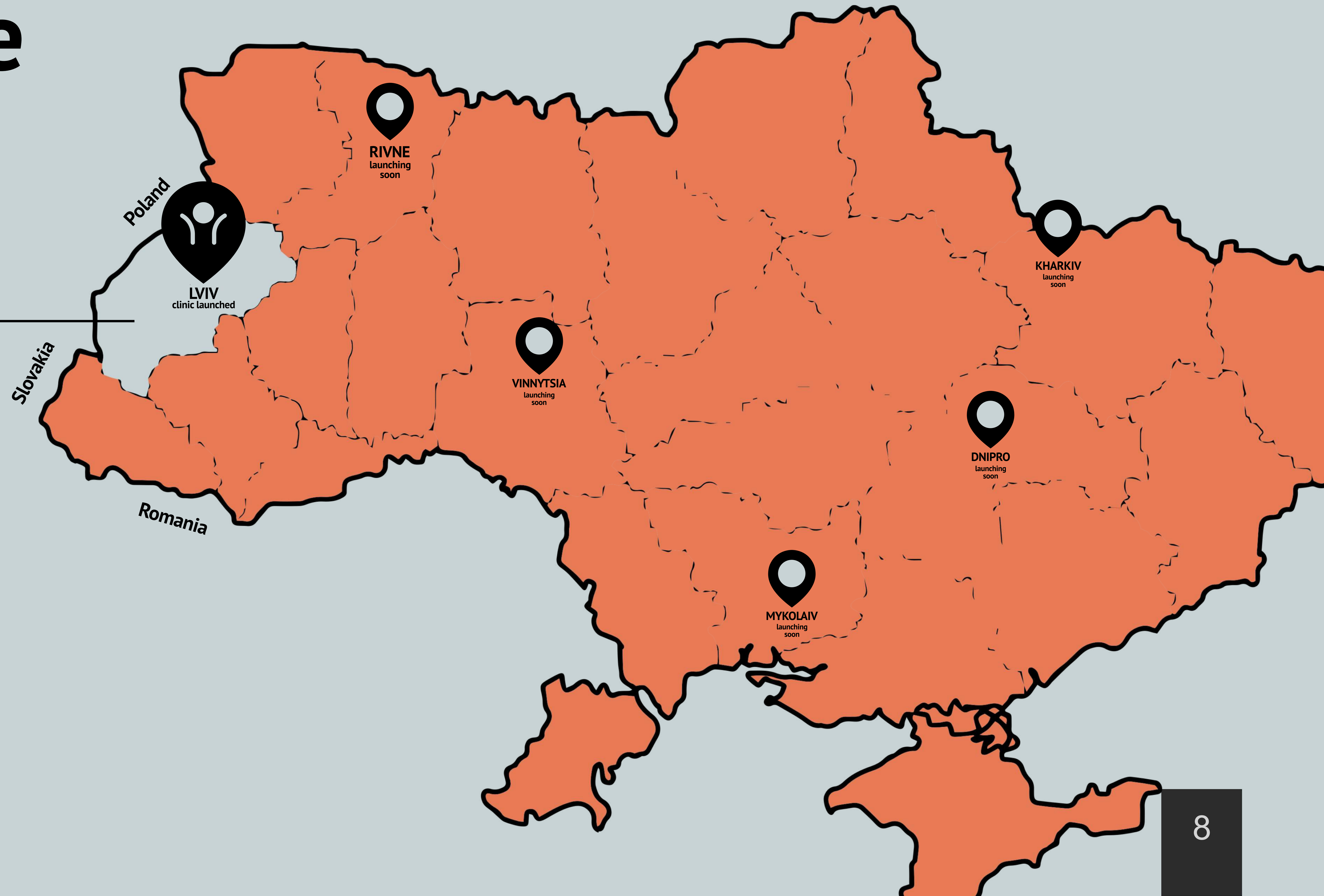


# The first Superhumans Center in Lviv

# Fundraising: \$24 million to launch Center \$30 million for stages 2 and 3



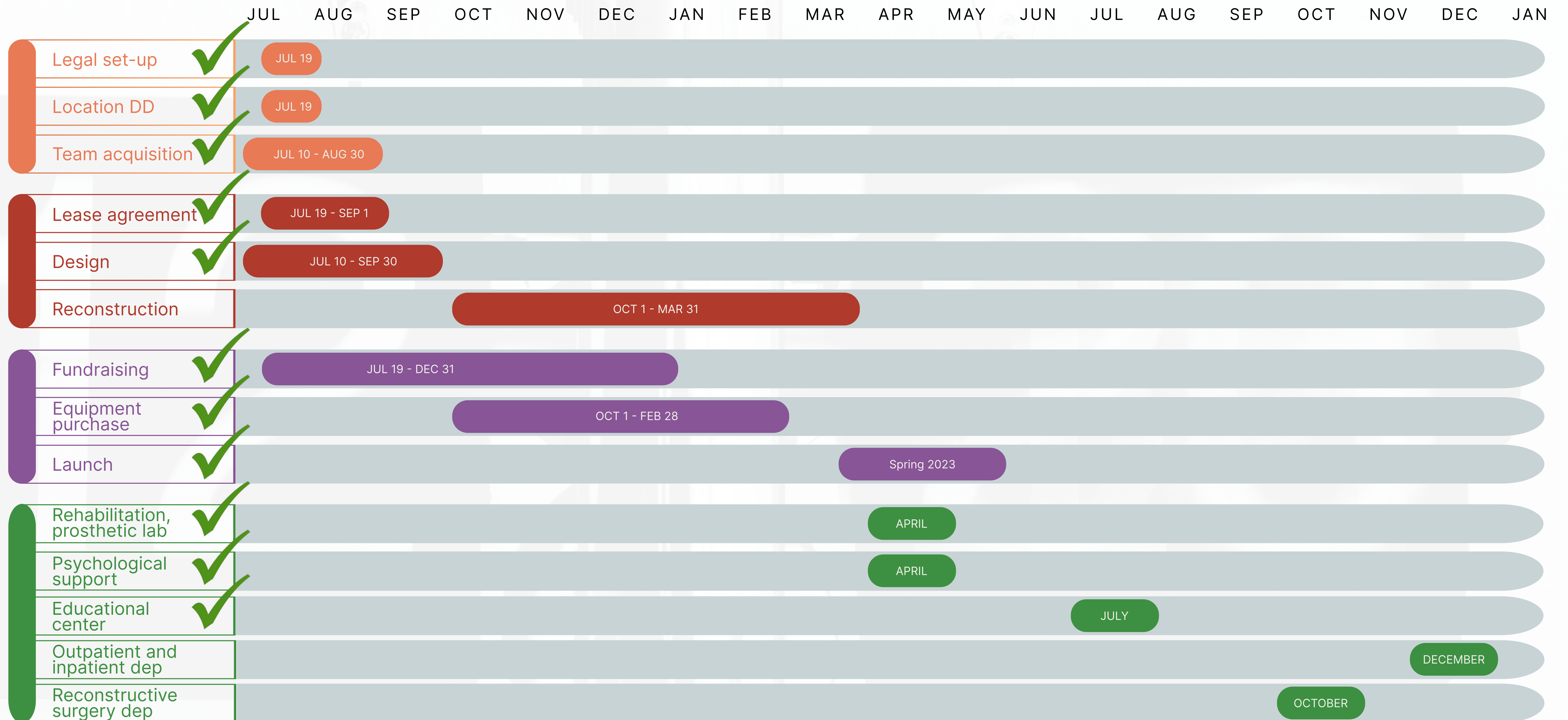
**Stage 1: \$24 million**  
Reconstruction of the existing hospital facility  
Purchase of equipment  
One year annual salary and training of medical personnel and social workers.  
One year of prosthetics, implant supplies and other materials

**Stage 2: \$20 million**  
Launch of the R&D Department of Prosthetics/Components and production  
Operating costs for year 2  
Creation of Center of Excellency to train the trainers from all of Ukraine

**Stage 3: \$10 million**  
Launch of rehabilitation facility  
Geographic expansion to other regions of Ukraine
