According to official data, approximately **50,000** patients will need prosthetics by the end of 2024. Taking into account that 40% of Ukrainian territory is mined, many more people will lose their limbs. Most of the patients have multiple amputations and complex amputations, therefore requiring a long rehabilitation period and psychological support.

---

**Based on the experience of Iraq and Afghanistan**

Of 8,058 military casualties (level II+):

- 70.5% had major limb injuries
- 5.2% required amputation
- 88% of amputations caused by explosions
- 18% required more than 1 amputation

During Vietnam war 5.5% of all injuries required amputations

- Department of psychological support

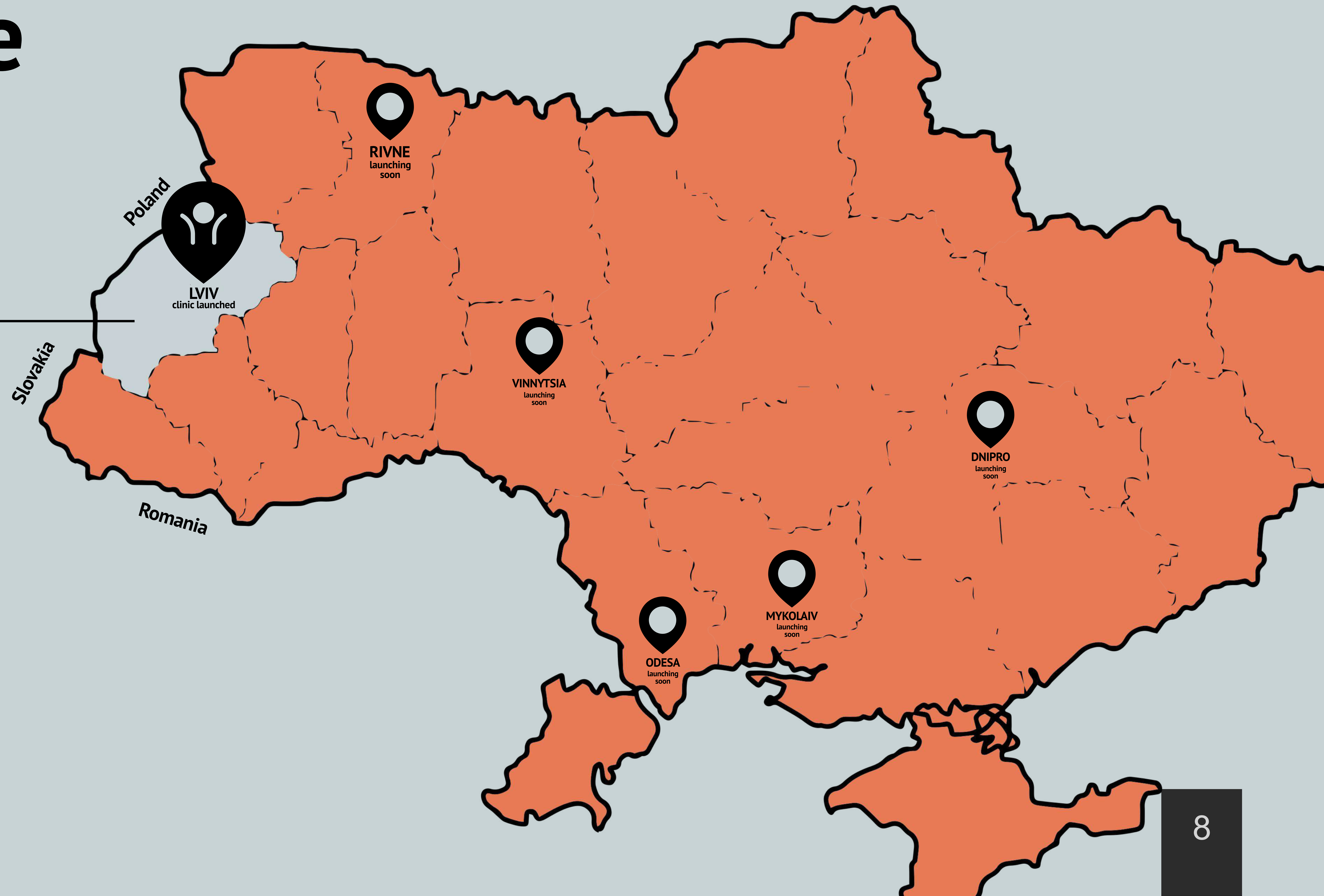




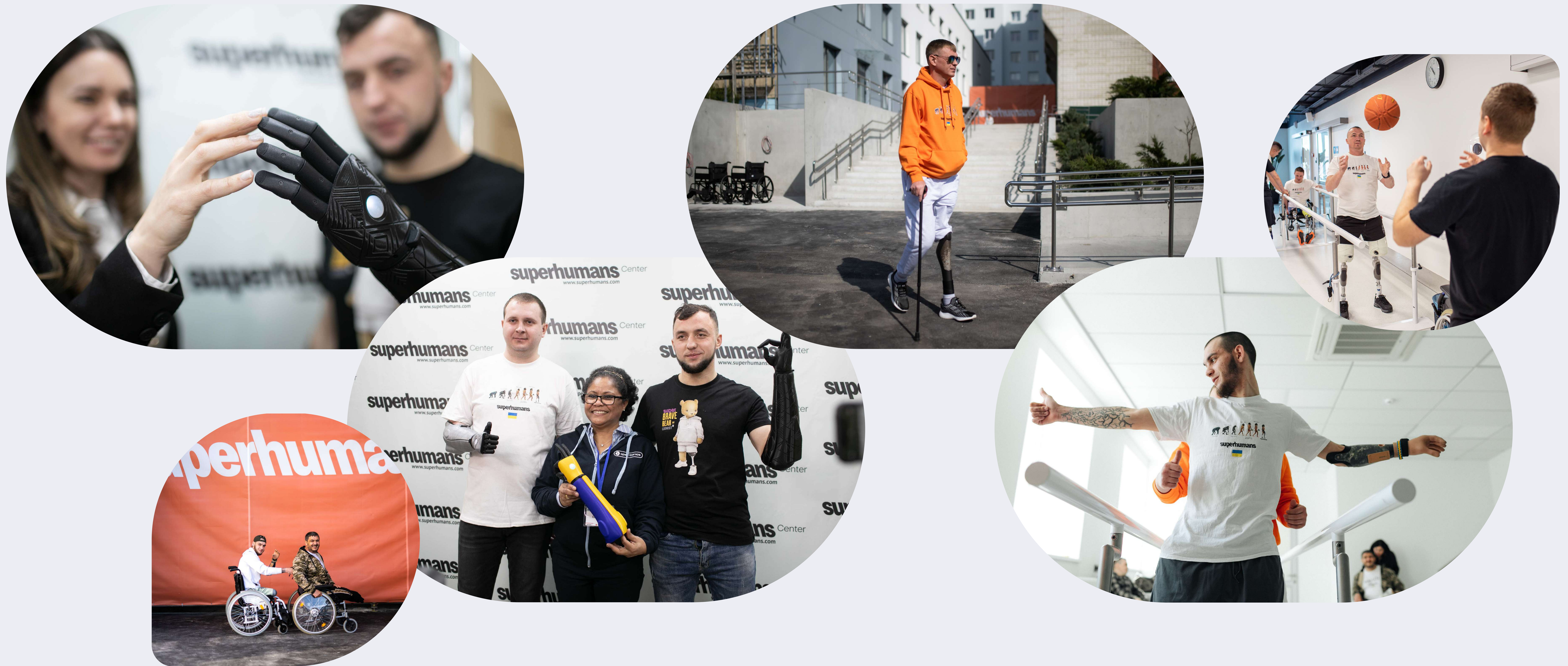
# Superhumans will launch centers all over Ukraine

- 3,000 patients per year







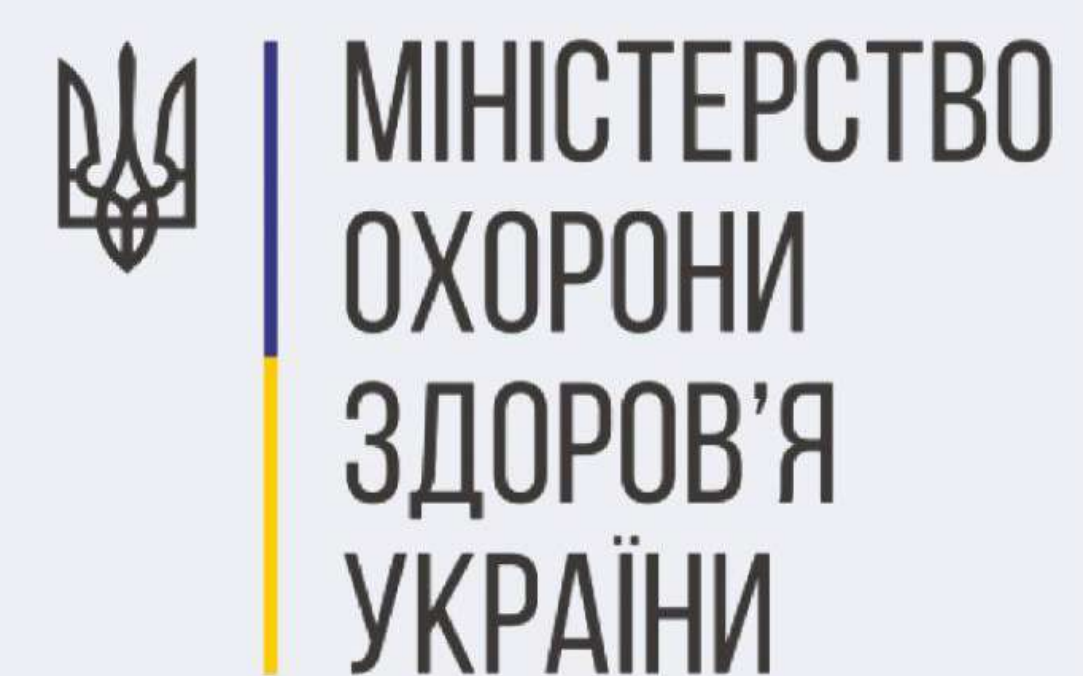

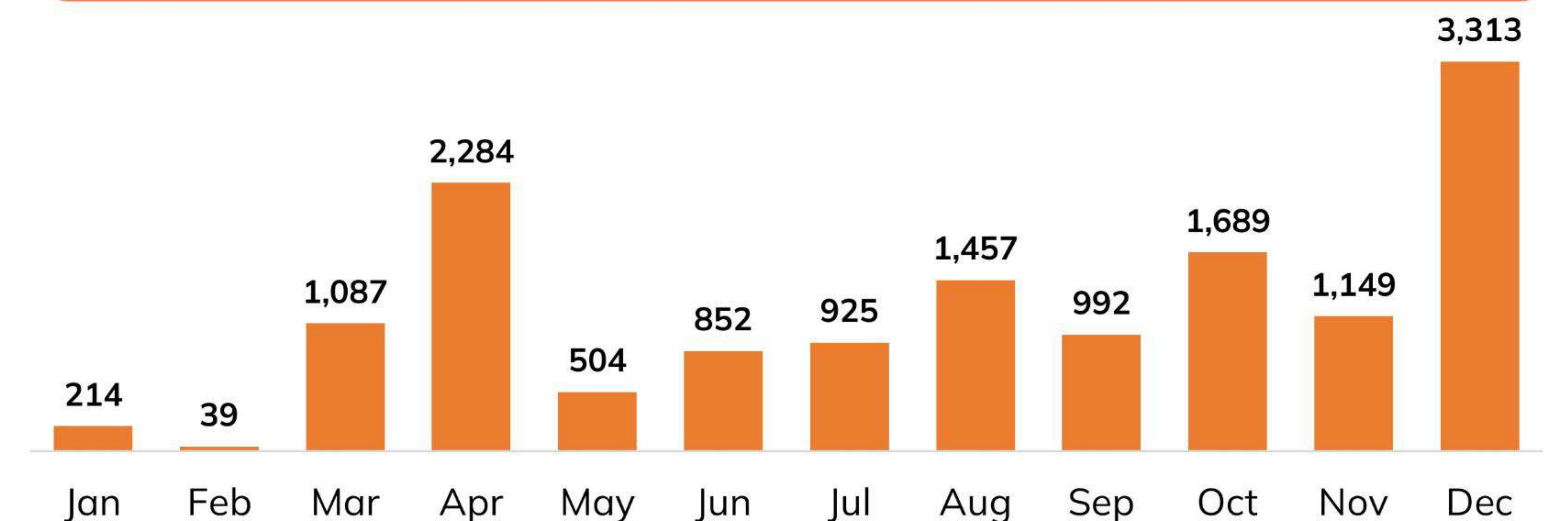
